Children & Young People's Strategic Partnership

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What is the Children & Young People's Strategic Partnership (CYPSP)

- A multi agency partnership of senior representation of statutory/voluntary/community organisations, councils and government departments involved in delivering services to children and families
- A single partnership that covers the WHOLE of Northern Ireland
- The CYPSP has been developed and supported by the Strategic Planning and Performance Group, SPPG (of Department of Health) to support the Children's Services Planning process and to develop a single integrated Northern Ireland Children & Young People's Plan every 3 years.

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Northern Ireland Children & Young People's Plan

- Legislative Context The Plan is a statutory requirement of The Children (1995 Order) (Amendment) (Children's Services Planning) Order 1998; Children's Services Co-Operation Act (NI) 2015

Partners are In the process of developing the new 2024-2027 Plan

NOTE: CYPSP is not an entity or agency – it is a Partnership – all 11 councils are members

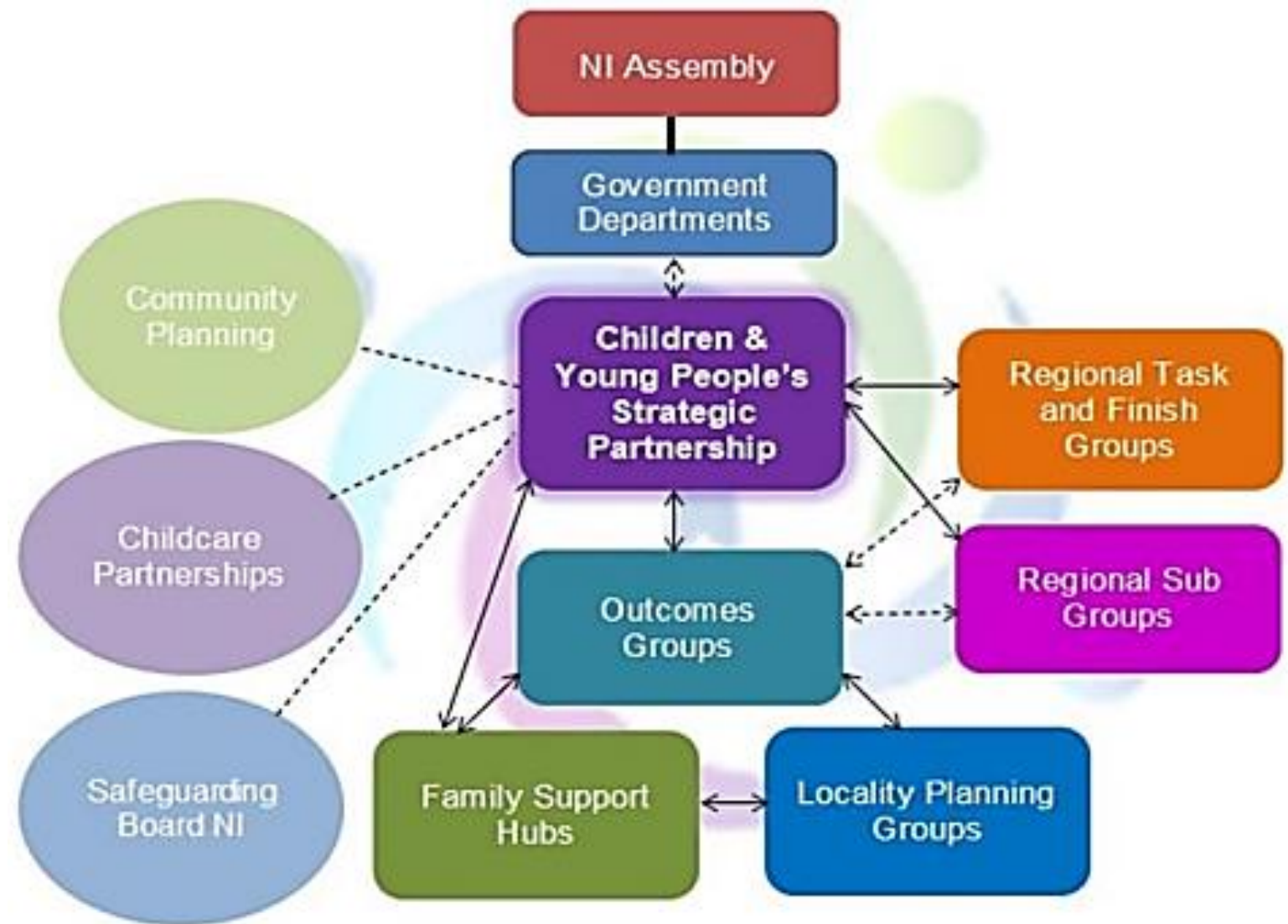
In respect of collaborative Leadership partners have agreed:

- Maintain the **voice of the child** as central to the planning process
- Maintain the **rights of the child** as central to the Children's Services Planning process
- Clarify **strategic objectives** in relation to services
- Promote **integrated provision of services** and effective **use of available resources**
- Ensure **consistency** of approach to **planning**
- Promote and establish high standard of **coordination and collaboration** between CYPSP partner agencies
- Facilitate **joint commissioning by agencies** when it is seen as appropriate **to meet the needs of children**

Accessing Early Intervention Services

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29 Family Support Hubs

- In 2023/24 **9,925** Families were Supported across NI
- **8,697** Children & Young People were supported
- **8,235** Parents were supported
- **21%** Children had a disability
- **2,163** Primary School, **1,197** Post Primary & **498** Pre-school children were referred for emotional & behavioural difficulties support
- School is second highest referrer

26 Locality Planning Groups

- Membership made up of **527** Statutory Voluntary and Community Organisations (inc EA, Youth Service & EWOs) delivering services to Children & Young People and their families in local communities.
- LPGs linked closely with 11 Community Planning partnerships
- Linking closely with Dept of Ed RAISE programme rollout via RAISE Co-ordinators

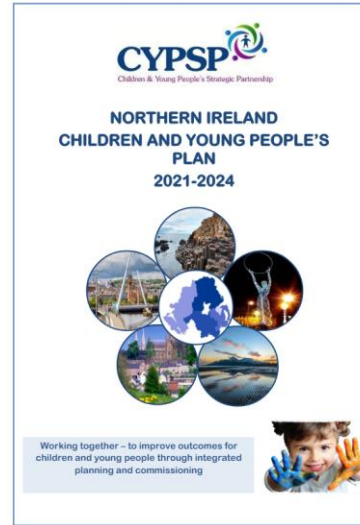

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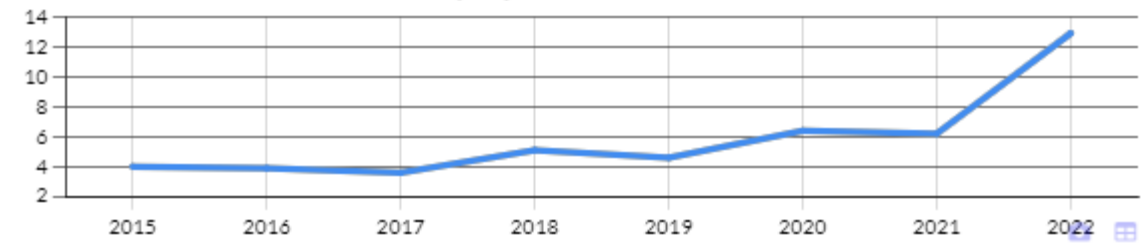

% of Primary Pupils less than 85% attendance



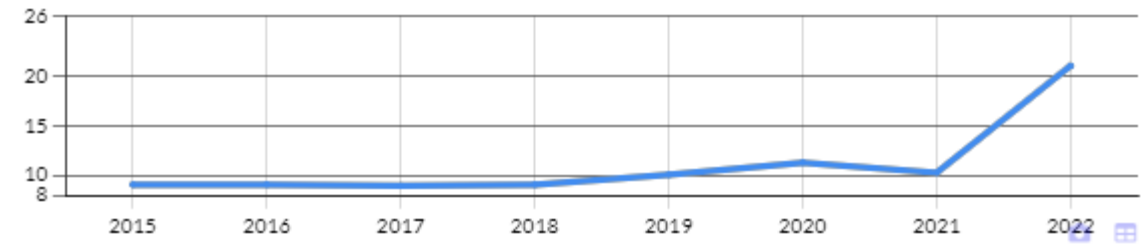

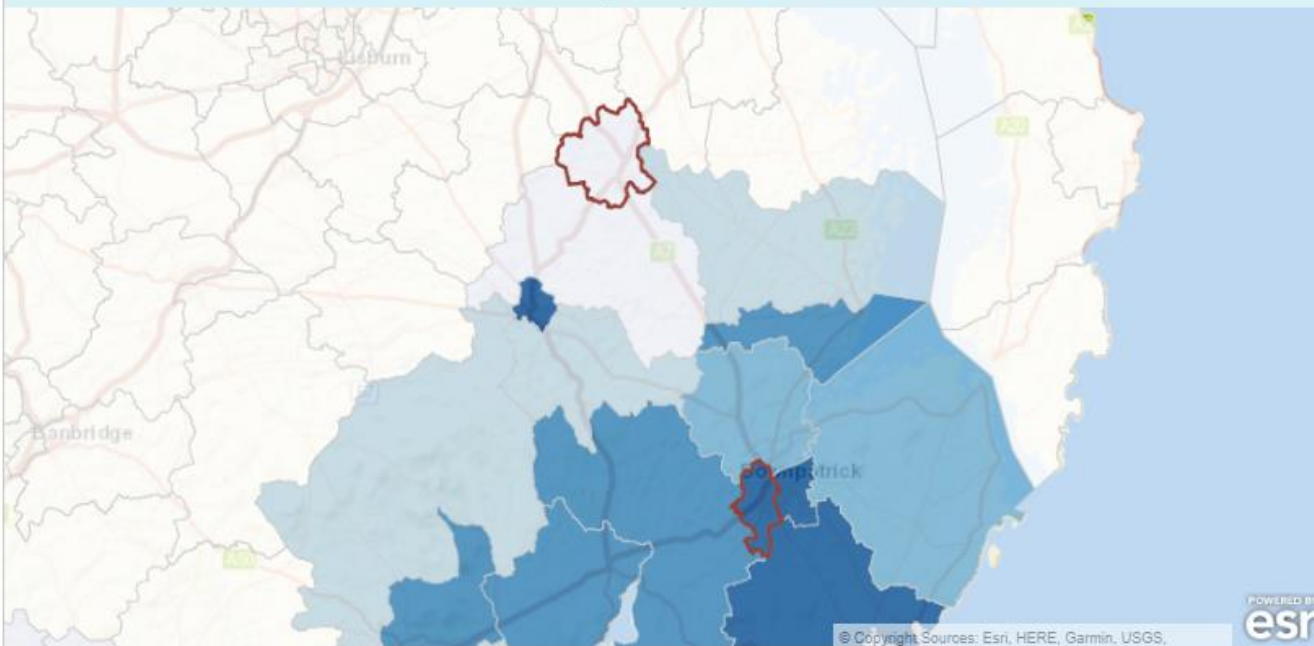

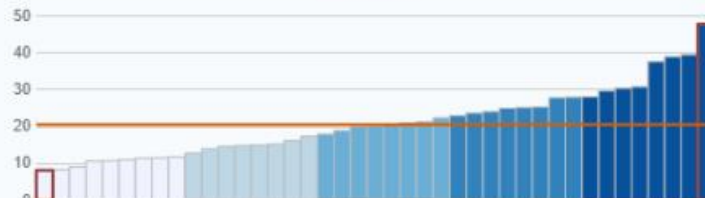
