Questions to ask a company/business representative.

- 3. What range of jobs/apprenticeships are available in your company?
- 4. Where do you advertise job/apprenticeship opportunities when recruiting? (website/social media/recruitment websites)
- 5. What is the selection process I would face if applying for a job in your company?
- 6. Does your company offer work experience opportunities for students in year 12 or year 13?
- 7. What support is offered to a new employee coming into work for the first time?
- 8. Do you have a professional development programme so that employees can gain additional qualifications and promotion?
- 9. Is there a gender balance within the company, are you actively seeking to employ more females/males?
- 10. What activities/events does the company have in place to build a sense of community, enjoyment, and fun into the workplace.

Questions to ask a career professional.

- 2. What does a day look like for you in your career?

Questions to ask the NI Careers Service

Questions to ask if you are considering courses at a Regional College after Year 12

- 2. What courses do you offer that are equivalent to 3 A levels?
- 3. What grades do I need to have in my GCSEs to get a place on a further education course at SRC/SERC?
- 4. If I don't pass GCSE English or GCSE mathematics, can I repeat these exams at SRC/SERC?
- 5. Do I need an employer if I want to do a hairdressing or beauty therapy?
- 6. What courses should I apply for if I am interested in a career in childcare/nursing/teaching?
- 7. What are the GCSE grades I need to have to get a place on a construction apprenticeship?
- 8. What is a traineeship and how is it different to an apprenticeship?
- 9. Do I have to do exams if I am an apprentice?
- 10.Do I get paid a training allowance as a trainee?
- 11. What wage can I expect if I have an apprenticeship?
- 12. What happens if I have an employer but don't have the grades to get onto an electrical/plumbing apprenticeship?

- 12.At 18, If I get a job and choose to do a degree on a part-time basis, do I apply in same way as students hoping to do full-time degrees? How does funding work for part-time degrees?
